GENERAL SHOW INFORMATION

Any rules and regulations contained herein shall supersede ARHA rules for the conduct of the ARHA World Championship Show. For rules not found in this list, refer to the ARHA Rule Book. Horses/exhibitors do not have to pre-qualify to participate in this show. The management has made every effort to present the highest level of sportsmanship. Great care has been taken to select judges with a broad experience and knowledge of Ranch Horses. The judge's decision in the show ring are their own responsibility and the management accepts no responsibility for their decision. All exhibitors, owners, and agents shall be under the direction of the Show Management and World Equestrian Center, and Show Officials, and shall not be responsible for loss or injury to any person, horse, tack or other personal items that are lost or in any way injured or damaged. All Exhibitors, spectators and guests are responsible for protecting their equipment and personal items. Remember to lock your trailers and vehicles.

PARTICIPATION/ELIGIBILITY/MEMBERSHIP & REGISTRATION

Horses and exhibitors do not have to pre-qualify to be eligible to participate in this show. All American Ranch Horse Association registered horses (Certificate Of Eligibility) will be eligible to compete in any and all classes, limited only by the restrictions regarding age of the horse (i.e. Junior/senior) or eligibility of the exhibitors (i.e: youth/amateur/novice). All owners and exhibitors must be 2022 members of ARHA. Photo copy of membership cards and ARHA Certificate Of Eligibility must accompany your entry form. Owners, Exhibitors and horses may join at the show, Membership &/or ARHA horse registration applied for after June 13th, will be charged a \$20 RUSH fee.

STALL INFORMATION

ARHA will use Stall Barns X & Y. The barns are located on each side of Arena 5 The barns are climate controlled along with Big Ass Fans. Stalls are 10 foot cement brick walls with padded flooring and includes electric power hook-ups, use of wash racks, 36" oscillating fan. A stall list will be posted on the ARHA website approximately one week before move-in. Please verify your stall count is correct and contact the office with any corrections. This online stall chart is not final until it is listed as the final chart (usually 1 day before move-in).

All horses participating in the show, ie: entered, turn-back, assisting on the grounds must be stalled. Horses CANNOT be tied to horse trailers. Exhibitors are not allowed to change stalls without the approval of show manager, you will be charged for both stalls. Stalls cannot be re-sold.

Stall fees must accompany stall reservation form. The deadline to order stalls is May 6th, 2022 to receive pre-entry discounted rate. Persons wishing to be stalled with trainers or other exhibitor **MUST** submit their stall reservations forms in the same envelope and form, along with the full payment of stall fees. Any stalls order after 5/6/2022 are not guaranteed placement with their stalling group. Payment is deposited upon receipt, but does not guarantee assignment to a requested stall. No more than one horse may occupy a stall. Stalls may only be used to house horses and tack only – any other commercial uses are strictly prohibited. Anyone using an unassigned stall for grooming, storage or stalling of a horse will be charged a full show stall fee for use of that stall. Anyone not obtaining their stall assignment from the Stall Manager, or found to be stalling horses in stalls not yet paid for, will be eliminated from the show by management. The Show Management has the right to make any needed changes in stall assignment. Contact ARHA Office for any early move-in or special arrangements.

NOTE: The person listed as the "stalled with" is responsible for all money due and will be held liable for all damages reported to stalls and is responsible for any payments due for damage or clean-up. A \$50 clean-up fee per stall/tack stall will occur if any personal belongings and/or trash is left. All shavings must be purchased through World Equestrian Center or a \$25 clean-up fee will be charged per stall.

STALL MOVE-IN /MOVE-OUT

Horses may move-in beginning at 7:30am on Wednesday July 13th. Any special arrangements or early move-in must be made prior to the start of the show. All stalls must be vacated by 9:30 am on Sunday, July 24th.

STALL FEES

Pre-Entry Deadline: May 6, 2022

Entire Show 7/13-7/24 - Pre-Entry: \$350.00/Stall or Tack Stall

Reservations after May, 6 2022: \$80 per day/stall/tack

Early Arrival prior to July 13th: \$60 /day

Day Stalls Pre Entry by May 6th: \$60/day after May 6th \$80/day

***There are no refunds on stalls unless we have a waiting list.

RV CAMPING

For RV Camping reservations, complete the RV reservation form and send to ARHA Office. These spots include water, electricity and sewer. Space reservations are offered on a first come/first serve basis. Spaces may be reserved at the lowest rate if received and paid in full by May 6th. All spaces should be reserved as soon as possible to guarantee availability. RV Forms to reserve a space may be found on the ARHA website. RV reservations are non-refundable unless we have a waiting list.

FEED AND BEDDING

Bedding will be the responsibility of the exhibitor/owner. Individuals must purchase bedding from the World Equestrian Center. Shavings are \$8.50 per bag. Any shavings that are not purchased through WEC will incur a \$25/per stall clean-up fee. Bedding orders will be taken by the World Equestrian Center phone or QR codes that are located in the barn aisle ways. All bedding payments must be made to the World Equestrian Center (WEC) at the time of ordering. Feed and hay may also be purchase through WEC.

SOILED BEDDING

All soiled bedding must be disposed of in designated garbage bins supplied by WEC.

SAFTEY

Congested aisles and alleys are an inconvenience and a safety threat for all other exhibitors and animals. Please use common courtesy and sensible judgement in regards to placement of chairs and other items that may block aisles. No aisle may be closed off. Show management reserves the right to ask any person, whose animal, equipment or decorations are creating a dangerous situation to be moved.

UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT

Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated. Unsportsmanlike conduct shall be defined as any action of disrespect, misrepresentation, false statement, deceit, or fraud directed to judges, show management, show representatives, show stewards, ARHA Staff, members or other exhibitors.

ABUSE

No one shall abuse or mistreat any horse and/or cattle in any manner whatsoever on the show grounds. Abuse is defined as an action, or failure to act, in which a reasonable prudent person, informed and experience in the customs of accepted training techniques and exhibition procedures, would be determined to be cruel, abusive, inhumane, or detrimental to the cattle/horse's health.

WASH RACKS

Horses are to be washed in wash racks only. Bathing animals in stalls, walkways, parking lot or any other area is prohibited. **Please be considerate and clean up after your horse!!!**

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Horses/exhibitors do not have to pre-qualify to participate in this show. The show management has made every effort to present the highest level of sportsmanship. Great care has been taken to select judges with a broad experience and knowledge of Ranch Horses. The judge's decision in the show ring are their own responsibility and the management accepts no responsibility for their decision. All exhibitors, owners, and agents shall be under the direction of the Show Management, the World Equestrian Center (WEC), and Show Officials, and shall not be responsible for loss or injury to any person, horse, tack or other personal items that are lost or in any way injured or damaged. All Exhibitors, spectators and guests are responsible for protecting their equipment and personal items. Remember to lock your trailers and vehicles.

This show is approved and managed by the American Ranch Horse Association. All classes will be conducted in accordance with these Show Rules and current ARHA rulebook. The final right to settle all conflicts arising at the ARHA World Championship Show is reserved by Show Management. If the Show Rules and the ARHA Rule Book do not cover a rule and/or condition, the ARHA Show Management will make the final decision.

RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY

It is agreed that by entering the ARHA World Championship Show, either as an owner or exhibitor or in any way assisting in the ARHA World Championship Show, the American Ranch Horse Association, the ARHA Executive Committee, staff, independent contractors and World Equestrian Center (WEC) shall not be held responsible in any manner for loss or damage to any animal, owners, exhibitors, handlers, affiliated parties, property or properties associated with these aforementioned articles. By entering the show grounds at the World Equestrian Center you are automatically excepting responsibility whether you read this or not.

RIGHT OF CANCELLATIONS

The American Ranch Horse Association reserves the right to cancel the World Show without notice and without liability any time prior to the contest. In this case, all entry, stall and RV money will be refunded.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEOGRAPHY

Only photographers and videographers under contract with the ARHA will be allowed to take photos or video any horse, exhibitor, owner, staff member or those associated with the ARHA World Show. Persons directly related to or associated with an exhibitor may take photos/video the exhibitor for personal use only but will not be allowed inside of the arena. The official World Show backdrop is reserved for the use of the official photographer ONLY. Award photos will not be taken in the arena but at the Photo Back Drop. You are welcome to bring your awards as well as friends and family for group photos with the Official Photographer..

Attendance at a ARHA-approved event , in whatever capacity, shall constitute authorization for ARHA, its agents, designed, or assigns to photograph, video tape, televise, or recorded by other means any person or Horse on the premises, of a ARHA-approved event, and shall further constitute authorization for the use of such person's name, voice and biography, or the name, pedigree and performance record of any Horse on the premises in conjunction with any photographic material.

ANNOUNCEMENT REQUESTS

The announcer stand will be off limits except for authorized show personnel assigned to that area. Show Management will not tolerate interruptions or loud activity in or around these areas. All announcement request must be submitted in writing at the show office. ARHA staff must approve all announcements.

Most important announcements will be made over barn's loud speaker, however, barn calls are a courtesy only, it is the exhibitors responsibility to be aware of class calls or schedule changes.

ERRATA

In the event of typographical or other errors in the Show Rules, the correct spelling or meaning shall substitute as the context applies.

DOGS & PETS

Owners assume all liability for any pet brought to the show. All pets must be kept on leashes while on grounds. No pets of any kind are allowed in the arena, holding pen or show office at any time. They may NOT be tied in aisle of stalling areas as a courtesy to fellow exhibitors, pet owners are required to pick up and dispose of ALL animal waste.

GOLF CARTS & SCOOTERS

Golf carts and scooters, etc. are allowed on the show grounds, however for safety of fellow exhibitors no golf carts, scooters, bicycles or other personalized motorized vehicles will not be allowed inside arena, barns, or trade show areas at any time (except for staff and handicap vehicles). Golf carts must yield to all pedestrians and horses and may not be parked blocking an entrance. Golf carts parked in front of handicapped entrances or parking will be fined. Handicap vehicles may obtain special permission from Show Office. ANY person driving ANY motorized vehicle must possess a current drivers license.

Golf carts may be rented from the World Equestrian Center's General Store. Phone: (352) 414-9267.

PARKING/TRAILER PARKING

Due to move in congestion, please limit unloading time as much as possible. Trailers must be parked in designated trailer parking after unloading. NOT IN FRONT OF BARNs. Handicap parking spaces are for Handicap Permit holders only.

SECURITY

Security of personal property (horses, tack, trailers, vehicles, etc.) is the responsibility of each individual. We recommend that you keep for vehicle and trailers locked. ARHA and World Equestrian Center will not be held responsible for any personal property.

ALCOHOL

No Alcoholic Beverages may be consumed or brought into the show arena, holding and/or make-up areas and/or practice arenas during an ARHA approved show.

INTERPRETATION OF RULES

The right to settle all questions or disputed incidents at the ARHA World Championship Show is reserved by the ARHA World Show Manager or their designated representative. All exhibitors or other participants, as a condition of admission, consent to such method and agree to be bound thereby by their entry form. Any objection to the award of the judge shall be lodged with the Show Manager immediately after the award is made.

ENTRY INFORMATION/PAYMENT PROCEDURE

All entries must be postmarked no later than June 13th, 2022, to avoid post-entry fees. Payments may be made in the form of personal checks, Visa, Mastercard, Discover, American Express or money order. A 4% service charge will be added to all credit and debit card charges. Make checks payable to the ARHA in U.S. funds drawn on a U.S. bank. Entries must be submitted on the official Entry Form for this show and may be photocopied as need. Exhibitors are responsible for any errors on their entry forms. Entry Forms must be complete, with all class numbers and proper signatures included. Incomplete Entry Forms may be returned unprocessed. Entries without payment of full fees, entries paid by returned checks or declined credit cards after the closed of entries will be considered post-entries, with additional fees assessed accordingly. Balance must be paid before you will be allowed to show. Declined cards will be treated as insufficient funds and may result in your horse being excluded from the show and/or late stall penalties or post entry fees being assessed. Any checks returned to ARHA Office due to insufficient funds will require certified funds to the ARHA office for entries/stalls/RV to be processed.

POST-ENTRIES BEFORE THE SHOW

Entries postmarked after 6/13/2022 (pre-entry deadline) will be considered post-entries, as will as any entries received without acceptable payment of fees. Classes added to current entry after June 13th deadline will be considered post-entries and will be charged accordingly.

POST-ENTRIES AT THE SHOW/ADDING CLASSES

Post-Entries must be made the day prior to when the class is to be held. All entries and/or change of exhibitors must be made at the show office. No class entry or exhibitor changes will be made at the gate and/or announcer stand. An ADD/DROP Form must be made at the Show Office. All late entries will assume "late" draw position.

ENTERING A CLASS WITH PAYBACK

If entering a class with cash prize, the owner must complete the financial information that is available in the Show Office to be eligible for payback. All monies paid are based on Composite Placing. Awards/Money won at the ARHA World Championship Show are subject to IRS 1099 reporting in accordance with IRS rules. Payouts will be mailed within 45 days of the last day of the show (9/6/2022). No checks will be issued at show. Any prize money will be paid by checks and made payable to the Payee information on the entry form. Payees are required to submit a appropriate tax form to receive payback within 45 days of the last day of show or prize monies will be forfeited. Checks must be cashed within sixty days. *No claims will be honored by ARHA World Show after September 30th of the year in which the premiums are won.*

CLASS PAYBACK

Open division classes as stated on show bill will have a jackpot with a purse of \$40 of each entry fee (late fees, penalties, office charge, and scratches are not included in prize purse.). Any Added money plus entry fee money will be payout as stated in the World Show Payback Schedule.

SCRATCHING A CLASS

As a courtesy to show management, any exhibitor wishing to scratch a class must complete a ADD/DROP Form at the Show Office before that class is called to the make-up pen. NO Refunds or credits for scratched classes.

SUBSTITUTING CLASSES

Classes may be substituted on a horse that is already entered. The substituted class must be changed with the show office at least 3 classes prior, then that said horse can substitute a class at a fee of \$25 per class. "No-Show" entries WILL NOT be eligible for substitutions or refund.

A horse may substitute for another horse in the same class in the show office at least 3 classes prior to the class. A fee of \$25 per class. The horse substitute MUST be owned and shown by the same exhibitor as the scratched horse. No-Show entries will not be eligible for refund.

SUBSTITUTING A RIDER

Riders may be substituted in OPEN classes, only if the horse is already entered in the class with the exception of classes that have prelims/finals. A Rider Substitute Form must be file at the show office three classes before the class enters the arena. A fee of \$25/class. Should a substitute exhibitor show a horse in a class that has not filed an update with the show office the said entry will be DQ from the class placing and no refund will be given.

PAID TRAIL WARM-UPS

Paid Trail Warm-ups will be held on Thursday, July 14th in ARENA C from 8:00AM – 8:00 PM. Each horse/rider has 5 minutes on the pattern. Up to three (3) horses will enter the arena at a time and will be allowed 5 minutes for practice. At the end of the 5 minutes all horses **must** exit the arena. Upon arrival come to the show office and enter your exhibitor # and time slot. No one can sign up for back to back slots for initial sign-ups unless there is no one else there so everyone has had an opportunity to run. EXHIBITORS NUMBERS MUST BE WORN DURING PRACTICE RUNS!

PAYMENT OF FEES

Checks should be made payable to ARHA in US Funds only. A \$50 penalty will be added to the amount due on any returned check. Returned checks not cleared by July 1, 2022, will result in post-entry charges being assessed to all associated entries. Checks will be deposited on the same day received. Credit Cards— American Express, Visa, MasterCard or Discover cards are accepted for entries and all show related fees. When entering: provide the account number, card expiration date, security # on the back of card (AMX use the 3 on front), street number, zip code, exact name appearing on the card, ARHA membership number. Please be aware there is a 4% processing fee on credit cards. Charges made at the show will require the use of the actual credit card. In the event that the credit card is declined, post-entry fees will apply if card is not honored by July 1, plus a \$50 insufficient funds fee.

PAYMENT INFORMATION

At the show-You will need to bring an open check or credit card information to the Show Office when checking in. In the event that no charges are incurred during the event, your check will be returned to you. Trail Practice will be need to be added to your show tab by Tuesday, July 14th Trail Warm-up day. Separate payment will no longer be taken at the practice pen.

OFFICE FEE

There will be a one-time \$80 administrative office charge for each horse entered. This fee is assessed only one-time per horse regardless of the number of classes and exhibitors that are entered. This fee is non-refundable.

CONDITION CHANGES

The ARHA reserves the right to interpret, modify or amend the conditions or arena usage for classes at the ARHA World Championship Show.

VET SCRATCHES/REFUNDS

Horses that become sick or injured PRIOR to the start of the show must submit a vet's statement concerning the condition of the horse, the horse's registration name and number and date the injury or sickness occurred. The documentation must be received in the ARHA Show Office PRIOR to the horse's first class for any refund to be considered. As of the first day of the show, only statements from the Official Show Veterinarian, along with official class scratch form will be accepted for horses that become sick or injured on the show grounds. All documentation must be in the Show Office PRIOR TO THE CLASS ENTERING THE ARENA. Forms/documentation received after the class has entered the arena will not result in refunds of any kind. If a horse does not compete in a class in which it is entered and a vet certificate and official scratch form has NOT been received, the entry fee will be forfeited. If a horse is disqualified from showing by officials or management or if a horse is entered and not shown, all fees will be forfeited. Office and cattle fees are non-refundable in cases where horses are vet scratched 15 days prior to the first day of the show (June 29th, 2022).

The above mentioned are only instances in which refunds will be allowed. At the conclusion of the show and after completion of financial review, the class entry fee(s) will be refunded less a \$25 per class office charge. Absolutely no refunds for office fees (after June 29th), cattle fees (June 29th) No RV fees, stall fees or credit card surcharge fees will be given under any circumstances.

Refund checks, for all entries paid by check will be mailed approximately 30-45 days following the last day of the show. For all entries paid by credit card refunds will be credited to the original card approximately 30-45 days after the last day of the show. No refunds will be made on amounts of \$10 or less. No refund allowances can be applied to charges while at the show. This is the only circumstance under which refunds will be issued.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

To comply with state animal health regulations, all horses will be required a negative Coggins (Equine Infectious Anemia) dated within one year. All out of state horses must have a thirty (30) day health certificate and negative coggins papers. You must present the required paperwork at show office before the show packet can be picked up. If required paperwork is not available, the horse will not be allowed to compete and all entry fees will be forfeited. *No exceptions.*

RIGHT OF REMOVAL

The American Ranch Horse Association reserves the right to prohibit any person or horse from showing and to remove any person or horse from the grounds, for ANY REASON, without being liable for compensation. All animals are subject to a physical inspection by the Show Veterinarian at the discretion of the Show Management. Any horse deemed contagious by Show Veterinarian must be removed from the show grounds immediately. Any horse on the grounds in immediate need of veterinarian care will be treated at the expense of the owner if the horse's owner(s) cannot be located.

ADMISSION TO THE ARENA

No person will be permitted to enter the arena, except participants in the class, turnback or herd holders, judges, scribes, and show personnel. NO DOGS ARE TO BE IN THE WARM-UP AREA or ARENA.

COMMERCIAL EXHIBITS/VENDORS

If an individual wishes to sell, display, or advertise tack, clothing, jewelry, furniture or any miscellaneous merchandise or service, a signed vendor contact must be filed with ARHA. In addition, the merchandise must be sold in designated vendor areas only. No items may be displayed or sold out of barn, stall or parking lot. All of the ARHA Logos are copyrighted and cannot be reproduced without permission from ARHA. Vendors are subject to Florida State Retail and tax law. Vendors must provide a copy of their liability insurance.

ARENA GATE CALL

Barn calls are a courtesy and will be made for each class. Regardless of circumstance's it is the exhibitors ultimate responsibility to report to their class on time.

GATE RULE

All exhibitors are required to check in with gate steward one class prior, and once you have checked in you must stay in designated holding area. A one minute gate rule will be enforced. Once the final call for class has been given, the gate will be closed in one (1) minute. No late participants will be accepted and no refunds will be given for missed classes. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be on the grounds and ready to show on the day of his/her scheduled classes without public notice.

TACK CHANGES

A maximum time period of three (3) minutes after class will be allowed for tack changes. All tack changes are to be made in makeup area. Once the gate is closed no contestant may enter the arena. Tack changes must be pre-scheduled with Gate Steward/Equipment Judge.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Any exhibitor using an electronic device in the show arena will be immediately disqualified. (Any exceptions must be made prior to the class with show management approval).

EXHIBITOR/BACK NUMBERS

Entry numbers will be assigned to each horse, not the exhibitor. This number is to be used for all classes in which the horse is entered. Entry numbers in all performance classes with the exception of showmanship and in-hand trail, must be displayed on both sides of the saddle pad or will result in disqualification. Any entry entering the arena without a number or with the incorrect number will be disqualified. Exhibitors *must* use the entry numbers assigned by ARHA World Championship Show (WCS). In the event of a lost back number, a \$20 fee will be assessed for a replacement.

TIMEOUTS/EQUIPMENT FAILURE

There will be no time outs or reruns for equipment failure. If an equipment failure causes a delay or run to be discontinued, the entry will be disqualified.

CLASS CONFLICTS

In the event that a horse or exhibitor is entered in two classes in separate arenas that have a potential to be showing at the same time, notify the Equipment Judge at least one class prior to the conflict. The Equipment Judge will make an attempt to accommodate conflicts. Please keep the Equipment Judge advised if your situation changes.

HOLDING/WARM-UP PROCEDURE

Exhibitors must check in with the holding area. The Equipment Judge(s) will call exhibitors to enter the arena in their posted order of go. We ask that only exhibitors in the class that immediately follows the class in the arena be in the holding area. It is the exhibitors responsibility to report to their class on time.

EQUIPMENT JUDGES

Equipment Judges shall be responsible for attire and equipment rule interpretations. Final interpretations are the responsibility of show management. All bits, tack, appointments and attire shall be checked by equipment judge prior to entering the arena. Any equipment considered to be inhumane and/or illegal by the official equipment judge must be removed or entry into the arena will be denied. The equipment judge may disqualify an entry for illegal equipment, improper attire, inhumane treatment, unsoundness/lameness or presence of blood on the horse. The equipment judge(s) may serve as an official alternate judge at the discretion of show management.

Use of prohibited equipment, including, but not limited to: saw tooth bits, hock hobbles, tack collars, or metal hackamores; riding in a curb bit without a curb strap; wire or solid metal curb straps no matter how padded; wire cavason; wire or cable tie-downs (inless wrapped or padded); bumper bits; metal bosals (no matter how padded); chambones; headstalls made of metal (no matter how wrapped or padded); twisted rawhide; or rope maybe used on horse's head (3/8inch rope may be used with a slip/gag bit); running martingales used with curb bits and/or used with out rein stops.

OPEN ARENA/LONGING

Exhibitor may use any open arena time as scheduled and arenas will be open 30 minutes after the show ends each day. ABSOLUTELY NO longing will be allowed in either the indoor arena or warm-up pen at any time. Horses may be longed outside areas only. Horses are not allowed to be turned loose at any time in any of the arenas. There is a \$50 fine for any horse caught longing in the arena.

BREAKS

ARHA reserves the right to reschedule any published breaks as necessary. Additional break will be announced as deemed proper according to the progression of the show. Announcements made at show will take precedence over show bill. Lunch Breaks will be one hour and will be announced except where noted on show bill. ARHA reserves the right to make arena changes as needed to ensure classes and show runs efficiently and smoothly.

JUDGING PROCEDURE

Great care has been taken to select judges with broad experience and knowledge. The judges' decision in the show ring are their own responsibility. Horses will be judged under a Two-Judged System with double points given under each judge. (exception of ATRH, Sweepstakes or any other specified classes on show bill), with the official World Champion and Top Ten Placings being determined by World Show Point Tabulation (below). ARHA National points will be awarded to horses in each class under each judge's placing with the exception of grand & reserve in conformation classes. Class Results are considered final upon receipt of judge's cards, unless an error in tabulation has occurred. ARHA reserves the right to correct obvious error on judge's cards when detected without recourse from exhibitor and to substitute a judge or change schedule assignment during show.

DISQUALIFICATIONS

Abuse – Any horse that shows evidence of fresh blood in the mouth, nose chin, shoulders, barrel, flank or hip area will be considered to be abused and may be excused from the arena.

Dishonesty – Any exhibitor that has made or caused to be made any false statements in regard to any animal or article exhibited, or if any exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with judges in the performance of their duties, he or she shall be excluded from exhibiting.

General– In all individual work classes, simple majority opinion of judges shall prevail, such as off pattern and lameness.

Lameness– A horse will be excused from the arena if a simple majority of judges disqualify the entry due to lameness. See ARHA Rule Book for complete rules regarding lameness. A judge's decision as to the lameness of a horse is final and is not subject to protest.

Blood Disqualification– In all classes and all divisions of classes, judges and/or equipment judges may disqualify horse(s) from the class if fresh blood is found on the mouth and/or body areas of a horse (including but not limited to the barrel, flanks, belly, sides, shoulders). Judges and/or equipment judges have sole authority to determine if the blood found on the horse warrants disqualification from the class and the judge's or judges' decision is final and not subject to protest.

Loose Horse– Any horse that becomes separated from its handler or rider and cannot be caught by the original exhibitor or is beyond the exhibitors control may be disqualified and excused from the arena.

Exhibitors are not allowed to wear earpieces or to have wireless contact with anyone during the course of a class.

Horses that go off pattern or DQ'ed during a class will be whistled out and excused from the class and will not be allowed to complete pattern.

CLASS TIE-BREAKER

In the case of a tie, ARHA Show Management will randomly designate which judge will break the tie, and there after judges will be rotated to break ties. If there is still a tie for World Champion Title/Awards a coin flip will be used to break the tie. Judges and Show Management decision is final.

WORLD SHOW TABULATIONS

Points will be tabulated on the following basis in classes that have more than one (1) entry for World Champion placings. The point system below will only be used to calculate world placings and do not reflect the ARHA points earned.

- 1st place=55 pts • 2nd place=45pts • 3rd place=36pts • 4th place=28pts • 5th place= 21pts • 6th place =15 pts • 7th place =10 pts • 8th place=6 pts • 9th place=3pts • 10th place =1pts

PATTERNS

All patterns will be printed in a pattern book. Pattern Book will be available on the ARHA web site on the World Show page or may be purchased booklet for \$6.00 and will be included in your Exhibitors Packet. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to check the boards in the holding area before their class starts in case any changes and/or corrections to the pattern have occurred.

PROTESTS

All protests must be given to the show office in writing and signed by protester within 12 hours of the time of the cause of the protest and must be accompanied with a \$100 protest fee.

ATTIRE

All exhibitors are required to wear appropriate western attire as per the current Rulebook.

RESULTS POSTING

Results for each World Championship class will be posted at the Show Office. High point and class results will be published on-line following the conclusion of the World Show. After they are published on the ARHA web site, the results are deemed final.

AT-WILL CLASS AWARDS

Class placing of the Top Ten class winners the time and location will be announced.

DUPLICATE BUCKLES

Duplicate World Champion buckles as well as Reserve World Champion and Top 10 buckles are available for purchase for a limited time through ARHA office.

All entries must be postmarked by June 13, 2022 in order to pay the pre-entry fees.

Entries, Entries may be paid by personal check, money order, Visa, MasterCard, Discover or American Express. There is a 4% service charge on all credit cards.

The Show Office is located in Arena 5.

Show Office Hours: Wednesday, July 13th 11:00 am - 9:00 pm

Thursday, July 14th through Friday, July 22nd 7:00am - 8:00 pm

Saturday July 23rd 7:00 am - 2:00 pm

These are the only times exhibitor packets may be picked up, class adds, scratches or substitutions may be made. Post Entries must be made the day prior to the class that is to be held. All show tabs must be closed on 7/23 by 2:00 pm. or a \$50 fee will be charged for any open tabs after 2:00 pm and no receipts will be available.

The following must be brought to the show office to pick up exhibitor packets:

You will need to an open check or credit card to the Show Office when checking in.

(In the event that no charges have incurred during the show, your check will be returned to you) along with the horse's Health Certificate/Negative Coggins. If you did not include your ARHA membership card(s) and Certificate Eligibility with your entries you will need them too.

You will need to come to the show office before you leave to verify stall condition. A \$50 clean-up fee per stall/tack stall will occur if any personal belongings and/or trash is left.

WORKING ORDER

All individual work classes will have a working orders will be decided or drawn by show management. The work order will be posted in the holding area. All late entries will assume "late" draw position. Show management reserves the right to make changes as deemed necessary. If an exhibitor does not show up for their turn in working order, it will be considered a missed class and they will not be moved in the work order and will forfeit all entry fees.

If you or your horse are entered in back-to-back or concurrent classes and feel that this will cause a time constraint you must inform the show office by 6pm the day prior to the class and request change in order of go. Adjustments shall only be requested for direct horse or exhibitor conflicts. No adjustment will be made for trainer's convenience or non-show conflicts - order of go adjustment are made for direct horses and/or exhibitor conflict. If possible, show management will then adjust your working order. If you do not contact the show office prior to 6pm the day before the classin question, we may not be able to accommodate your request. Once working orders or cuts have been posted, changes will not be made unless approved by show management.

CUTS

In large classes when cuts are necessary, the cuts will be determined by a random draw. Each cut will enter the arena for judging and will be placed by all judges. Top placings entries from each cut will return to the arena for a final go-round. The same exhibitor must exhibit the same horse in both the cut and the final. The same equipment must be used on each horse in the cut and final.

JUDGE'S VIDEO REVIEW

Judge will automatically review video runs before cards are submitted in scored classes that lack concurrence when major penalties, disqualifications, zero scores or "no-scores" are involved or when a judge requests a review. Lack of concurrence concerning non-major penalties will not be reviewed and cannot be changed once submitted. No judge shall be required to change his/her score following a video review. Each judges' decision is an individual call.

LEADLINE CLASSES

A walk-only Leadline class will be offered for participants 8 years and under. Participants in this class will not be allowed to compete in any other class offered at the show. A family member is required to be an ARHA current member. This class requires pre-entry be made by June 13, 2022. No post entries will be accepted This class will not be judged and each participant will win a blue ribbon and specially designed buckle for this class. The Leadline class will not count towards any high point awards.

YOUTH WALK-TROT 10 & UNDER

All classes offered will be judged in the same manner as their regular Youth division counterparts (eliminating the lope).

Eligibility– Any ARHA member 10 and under is eligible for this division. Entries in this division may not enter any class at the 2022 ARHA World Championship Show that requires a lope or any Lead line class not designated Walk/Trot. Conformation and Showmanship are permitted in any youth or novice class.

Points– The Walk trot classes are non-point earning, but will be designated as World Champion and Reserve classes and will be counted for Youth Walk-Trot High Point Awards. Youth 10 & Under Walk-Trot exhibitors will also be eligible to compete in the Youth Team Tournament.

Lil Buckaroo Flag Work- Will be offered for Youth 10 & Under that have NEVER competed in any cattle class. Time will start when the flag moves. Rider has 30 seconds. Youth rider is expected to simulate working a cow as in a Ranch Boxing class, preferably at a walk or trot but rider will not be penalized for loping to maintain position. This class will be judged by Ranch Boxing class rules.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

All conformation classes/divisions will be offered in 2 & Under and 3 & Over. No Grand and Reserve will be offered, only World Show Top Ten placings

RANCH RIDING CLASS PRELIMS/FINALS

17 Junior, #6 Amateur, #37 Senior, #26 Youth 13 & Under, # 27 Youth Ranch Riding 14-18, #16 Novice Amateur, and #17 Novice Youth Ranch Riding classes will have Prelims on specified day and a Finals that will be held on Friday, July 17th. If there is less than 15 entries in a class there will be no Prelim class and horses. Any horse that shows in the Prelims but scratches for any reason will not be placed. No placing, ribbons or points will be awarded in preliminary selection. There will be no less than 12 horses in each of the class finals. All Placings, awards/ribbons/prize monies will be awarded in the Finals only. The same exhibitor must show the same horse under all the judges in a class including preliminary/splits and finals.

“AT WILL” CLASSES

ALL Ranchmanship, Horsemanship, Ranch Reining, and Ranch Trail classes will be run “AT-WILL” in designated areas per show bill. There will be an on-line sign-up sheet for these classes and will run first come/first serve basis. You may show any time during the specified time that is on the show bill. It is the Exhibitors responsibility to show within the allotted time specified. You must be checked in with Gateman by the close of time of class to be considered enter or you will be unable to run. When entering the class, the exhibitors must give the judges/show officials the class number they are competing in and their designated exhibitor number before they enter the arena.

SELECT DIVISION CLASSES

Select classes are offered for Amateur Exhibitors 50 years & older. Exhibitor must hold an ARHA Amateur Card. Select classes must enter the Amateur class and will run concurrently with the Amateur class except for Conformation and Ranch Riding. Concurrent cattle classes will pay only 1 cattle charge. Select Classes are not an ARHA approved division so you will not earn ARHA points. Select World Champion Buckles and other class awards will be presented. Amateur and Select division will not be combined for High Point Awards. *** See Select High Point Awards.

CLASS AWARDS

In all World Show classes, a Champion Buckle and vest will be awarded to all World Champion winners and the Reserve Champion will receive a trophy. Awards will be presented to 5th place. Ribbons will be awarded for 1st– 10th place.

TABULATION ERROR

If a tabulation error is suspected, a written inquiry may be presented to the Show Office within 12 hours after the completion of the affected class without the use of protest procedure, EXCEPT AT THE END OF THE SHOW WHEN ALL INQUIRIES MUST BE GIVEN BEFORE THE HIGH POINT AWARDS ARE PRESENTED. ARHA reserves the right to correct such errors without recourse from entrants.

CLASS TIE BREAKER

One judge will be designated as the tiebreaker for each class. In the event of a tie, the entry appearing the highest on the tiebreaker judge’s card is placed highest in the average. The judge designated as tiebreaker will be alternated from class to class.

WORLD SHOW TABULATIONS

A 2 judge system will be used at this show for all World Show Classes excluding any special classes, sweepstakes or the Top Ranch Hand. Points will be tabulated on the following basis in classes that have more than one (1) entry for World Champion placings. *The points system below will only be used to calculate world placings and do not reflect the ARHA points earned under each judge.*

- 1st place=55 pts • 2nd place=45pts • 3rd place=36pts • 4th place =28pts
- 5th place= 21pts • 6th place =15 pts • 7th place =10 pts • 8th place=6 pts
- 9th place=3pts • 10th place =1pts

AMERICA’S TOP RANCH HAND

Entry fee for America’s Top Ranch Hand is \$695.00 and includes cattle charges. Entry fee must be postmarked by 6/13/2022. There will be a late fee for entries received after the postmark date, late entries will not receive ATRH jacket or vest. Entries received after pre-entry deadline will go to the bottom of the draw in the Herd Work portion of the class and are not guaranteed fresh cattle. Both owner and exhibitor must be current 2022 ARHA members. Entries are not valid with out complete fees paid. Substitution of a horse will be permitted providing the following documentation is received by 6:00 pm on the day before the first class in which the horse is to be substituted. Substitutions must meet the qualifying requirements: substituted horses must be owned by the same person or family. The following needs to be provided: Vet statement that the original horse is unable to compete due to illness or injury; and the entry form is properly completed with all the required information on the horse you are substituting. Horses competing may only be ridden by one exhibitor. No ARHA points will be awarded. ATRH will not count towards All Around Awards.

PAY OUT ON AMERICA’S TOP RANCH HAND

Pay-out will be based on the number of horses* entered plus \$3,000 Added money to the “overall” winners. *See World Show Payback scale. Each entry will receive an ATRH vest. Must have 15 horses for added money or payback will start with 2nd place money.

- 1) \$200 will go towards cattle costs
- 2) \$345 will be used for video and administrative costs.
- 3) \$150 of each entry fee will be added to Overall payback.
- 4) Trophy Buckle and \$500 added money will be pay to 3 places:
 - 1st-\$250; 2nd \$150; 3rd-\$100 on each class “go”.
 - a) WCH Reined Work (class 106)
 - b) Herdwork (class 67)
 - c) WCH Fence Work (class 116)
 - d) Cow Catching (class 118)

5) The Overall payback (\$150 each entry+ \$3,000 added) will be paid on the composite score under the 3 Judges in the 4 events. The overall winner will be awarded the Bob’s Custom Saddle.

6) Each Pre-Entered contestant will receive an ATRH jacket/vest.

7) No Refunds will be given

RANCHMANSHIP SWEEPSTAKES

For the Ranchmanship Sweepstake no ARHA points will be awarded and this class will not count towards any High Point Awards. There will be a Prelim class that will be held on Friday, July 15th class #28 with the Finals held on Wednesday, July 20th, class #92. Any horse that is shown in the Ranchmanship Sweepstakes Prelims but scratches for any reason will not be placed. No placing, ribbons or points will be awarded in preliminary selection. There will be no less than 10 horses plus ties in the class finals. All placings, awards/ribbons/prize monies will be awarded in the Finals only. The same exhibitor must show the same horse under all the judges in a class including preliminary/splits and finals.

No Refunds will be given but entry fee may be transferred to another horse that is owned by same person by 6:00 pm the day prior to this class providing the following documentation is provided: Vet statement that the original horse is unable to compete due to injury or illness, and the entry form has been properly completed with the horse you are substituting. Late fees, penalties, office charge, and scratches are not included in prize purse.

PAY-OUT ON RANCHMANSHIP SWEEPSTAKES

The Payout will be based on the number of horses entered and shown. Added money, will be paid to the “overall average” payback. Placings will be based on composite scores. No ARHA points will be awarded. A minimum of 15 horses must be shown for added money and payback will start with 2nd place monies.

- 1) 60% will be used for administrative cost.

2) 40% of the remaining purse will be paid back to the Contestants (Finals) with the overall payback + added \$1,000. In the Prelims Four Judges will be used with the high and low score being dropped. The Finals class will have 2 judges and the payback will be paid on the composite of the best two scores in the Finals.

Payouts will be mailed within 45 days of the last day of the show. No checks will be issued at show. All prize money will be paid by checks and made payable to the designated person on entry form. No checks will be issued without submitting a W-9.

CLASS AWARDS

Please check all awards before leaving the arena. ARHA will not replace awards after they leave the presentation area for that class. World Champions will receive custom buckle and Reserve Champions-5th place will receive awards. AT-WILL Classes Awards will be presented the next day before the start of scheduled classes.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TITLES

All classes offered at the 2022 ARHA World Championship are considered World Champions except specialty classes and lead line. First place winners on the average card are considered World Champions and second place winners on the average card are considered Reserve World Champions.

WORLD SHOW HIGH POINT/RESERVE AWARD

- Seven (7) High Point Saddles and Seven (7) Reserve High Point Breast Collars for each of the following Divisions will be awarded for the World Show High Point Award: Junior, Senior, Amateur, Amateur Novice, Youth 13 & Under - Youth 14-18 and Youth Novice. All Youth, Amateur & Novice Divisions will be tabulated on One horse/One rider combinations. The Open Division may be ridden by multiple riders with points tabulated on the horse. ATRH and Sweepstake classes will not count towards World Show High Point Award. Class entries will count per division but no divisions will not be combined. All exhibitors are eligible to compete for the World Show High Point Awards. Youth 10 & Under classes are not included in the Youth division. Youth 10 & under exhibitors cannot cross-enter in any other youth classes except Conformation and Showmanship. The World Show High Point Award will be presented to the Open Horse and the Horse/Rider Combination in each division, who earns the highest point total, High Point Champion, and the second highest point total respectively, Reserve High Point Champion.

SELECT HIGH POINT AWARD

Select Classes are for Amateur Riders 50 & Over. A Bob's Custom saddle will be presented to the highest point earner in select division, and a custom set of spurs to the second highest point earner. This award will be presented to the one horse/one rider combination. Exhibitor may enter as many Select classes as they choose to count towards this award. Select exhibitors are only eligible to compete for this award.

YOUTH 10 & UNDER HIGH POINT AWARD

10 & Under High Point Saddle

This award will be presented to the one horse/one rider combination earning the highest number of points and the second highest point total respectively. 10 & Under Youth Exhibitors may enter as many Youth 10 & Under classes as they choose but to be eligible for the 10 & Under High Point Saddle they must enter all 10 & under classes. Only Youth 10 & Under exhibitors are eligible to compete for this award. Youth 10 & Under exhibitors cannot cross-enter or compete in any other youth classes except Conformation and Showmanship.

WORLD SHOW TOP COW HAND AWARD

Three (3) divisions will be offered in the Top Cow Hand Award: Open, Amateur, and Youth. Youth & Amateur division will be tabulated on one horse/one rider combination. Open division may be ridden by multiple riders with points tabulated on the horse. Only these cattle classes Boxing, WCH, WRH, Herdwork, Ranch Boxing, Ranch Roping, Cow Catching, Cutting, and Ranch Cutting will be tabulated for this award. ATRH classes will not count towards this award. This award will be presented to the horse in the Open Division and the Amateur or Youth Horse/Rider combination who earns the highest number of points and the second highest number of points respectively in their said division. A minimum of four (4) cattle classes of your choice must be entered to be eligible for this award but may enter as many classes as you choose to count towards this award.

HIGH POINT/TOP COW HAND TABULATIONS

All of these Awards will be tabulated by using the World Show Point System under each judge.

HIGH POINT/TOP COW HAND AWARD TIES

If there is a tie for 1st or 2nd place for High Point /Top Cow Hand or Reserve High Point/Top Cow Hand in a division, ties will be broken first on the Horse, Youth/Horse combination, Amateur/Horse combination, or Novice/Horse combination, earning the greatest number of World Championships in their said division. If a tie still remain, the winner will be the entrant who entered the greatest number of classes. If a tie still remains, then the tie will be broken by a coin flip.

PRESENTATION OF HIGH POINT/TOP COW HAND /AMATEUR & YOUTH ROOKIE /YOUTH TEAM TOURNAMENT AWARDS

These awards will not be final until the last class in division has been tabulated. Awards will be presented at the Awards Banquet following the conclusion of the show on Saturday, July 23rd. Exhibitor must be present to pick-up award. No awards will be mailed. Ties will use the same tie-breaker as the High Point.

AMATEUR & YOUTH ROOKIE AWARD

Any ARHA Amateurs, Novice Amateurs, Youth and Novice Youth that are in good standings, and have never shown at the ARHA World Championship Show in any prior years are eligible. You may show in any class offered in your division. Points will be tabulated using the World Show Point System under each judge for each horse/rider combination in nominated division. Divisions will not be combined. The exhibitor earning highest number of points in their respective division be presented a custom trophy buckle! Any discrepancies must be made before the end of class # 110 or points will stand as posted. You must submit the Rookie Form by: July 14th at 8:00am EST with \$35 entry fee. Awards will be presented at the World Show Awards Ceremony on Saturday, July 23rd. You must be present to win. No awards will be mailed.

YOUTH TEAM TOURNAMENT RULES

The American Ranch Horse Association youth team will be selected based on the following criteria. The ARHYA Youth Committee has final approval over all team activity and those persons named on the youth teams.

1. A youth applying to be a member of the ARHA Youth Team must be a member in good standing with ARHA, consideration of the team will not begin until current year's membership has been paid in full.
2. Any youth wishing to participate on a Team **must** complete a written application and consent form and submit it to the ARHA Office **on or before June 13, 2022**. Application forms are available on the ARHA website www.americanranchhorse.net. Applications may be emailed to arhacontact@aol.com
3. Youth applying for the team must sign the Team Application, which acknowledges their awareness and understandings of the American Ranch Horse Association Youth Team Tournament Guidelines.
4. Youth applying for the team must supply a photo-copy of their ARHA Membership card and their horse's ARHA registration papers with their Youth Team Application.
5. No horse shall be substituted for another, unless veterinarian certificate is presented as verification that the horse is unable to be shown.
6. In addition to qualifying points the Team selection will also be based on the individual's ability to meet the requirements and directives of the ARHA.
 - A. Each Youth must acquire a minimum of \$50 in sponsorship monies or pay a \$50 entry fee which must be submit by June 13, 2022.
 - B. Participating in ALL fundraising events that the youth is in attendance for.
 - C. Exhibiting good moral character and sportsmanship.
7. Each team shall clarify a Youth Adult Advisor as well as a Youth Point Tabulator. The individual(s) must be at least 18 years of age and will be the contact person for the American Ranch Horse Association. The Youth Advisor will be responsible for entries for the team. The points tabulator will be in charge of reporting placing and points for their contestants. However, daily verification from the ARHA Show Office will occur. The Advisor, Tabulator, and participants must be a current member in good standings. Horses must be ARHA registered.
8. The team tournament will offer any Youth, Novice Youth, and 10 & Under class for the team tournament competition. Each rider must designate the (3) Classes to count towards their team's points. Entries must already be entered in this class for the World Show; World Show entry fees apply.
9. Each team will be allowed up to 5 (five) contestants, placings for the top 4 horse/exhibitor teams will count towards Youth Team Tournament totals. All ARHA Youth are encouraged to participate. If you don't have a team contact the ARHA Office and we will help you to get placed on a team.
10. Each team member must designate (3) three youth, novice youth or 10 & under Walk-Trot classes from the official world show classes listed on show bill to count towards the team total. Each team must fill out entry form and return by June 13, 2022.
11. The entry fee per contestant is \$50.
12. The Top 3 teams will be awarded prizes at the Awards Ceremony on Saturday, July 23rd. Must be present to except awards. No prizes will be awarded.

POINT SYSTEM AND AWARDS

1. The team with the most points at the end of the competition will be announced as the World Champion Youth Team of the Tournament.
2. Every contestant is required to follow the rules and guidelines provided by the ARHA Rulebook for each class.
